




The Alto Corner unit utilizes 3 Alto panels in its construction. The position of the supporting panel can be on either wall as seen below. It is also **highly** recommended that the corner unit be the starting point of your Alto closet line construction.



Corner Shelf and Toekicks




ALT-SP/CP

Corner shelves require 3 panels. It is recommended that the corner shelf be built first and lead into all other Alto systems.









Hardware Packs Needed ALT-HRDP-CORFS ALT-HRDP-CORTK





Take two corner shelves from box ALT-CORFS and insert rafix hardware. Insert hardware only where corner shelf will be attached to a supporting panel (2 empty slots on each shelf). Insert one rafix into one side of each toekick from box ALT-CORTK.






Take third corner shelf and insert wedgefix hardware in matching spots.


This will be used as the bottom fixed shelf

Step 2b

If applicable, take any extra corner shelves from box ALT-CORAS and insert wedgefix hardware from hardware pack ALT-HRDP-CORAS.




This will be used as adjustable shelf

Corner shelf unit requires three panels. Ensure you have all three located and ready for hardware setup. The unfinished ends of each panel should always be against the wall for all three panels.



Alto Side Panels are all symmetrical from top to bottom. Flip panel from top to bottom if needed to ensure unfinished side is against wall and not visible.


Insert and drill rafix screws into circled holes below on each panel. Refer to

Insert and drill rafix screws into circle holes below on each panel. Refer to previous page for mirrored panel.




Step 4b

For additional corner shelves, drill rafix screws into horizontally matching hole slots on all three of panels where the additional corner shelves will be placed.


Rafix Screw x6






Repeat as necessary for all adjustable shelves planning to be placed.

Line up panels against wall to prepare for bottom shelf insert as shown below. Back panel will be offset 3/4" from perpendicular wall.




Step 5b

Using a stud finder, search for the studs in the wall and drill the screws











Step 6b


Insert any additional corner shelves (wedgefix hardware) that will be under the middle fixed shelf now. Additional shelves should attach to rafix screws



Insert corner fixed shelf into next available rafix screws (middle) and press shelf into place.




Take screwdriver underneath pressed in middle shelf and tighten rafix clips to secure shelf to panels. Repeat for all 6 rafix clips.






Step 8b

Insert any additional corner shelves that will be above the middle fixed shelf now. Additional shelves should attach to rafix screws drilled in step 4b.



Insert corner fixed shelf into next available rafix screws (top) and press shelf into place.



Take screwdriver underneath pressed in top shelf and tighten rafix clips to secure shelf to panels. Repeat for all 6 rafix clips.
